



Isolation and Quarantine


- More than 1000 currently asked to be in isolation or quarantine

Face Covering Requirements

- Face covering is required in indoor public places of business for employees and customers.
- Face covering are not required:
 - when eating or drinking;
 - when in offices or cubicles and able to maintain physical distancing from others;
 - if a physical or mental disability limits the ability to wear a face covering;
 - If medical conditions that make it difficult to breathe when wearing a face covering;
 - for children age 0-12, although children between 2-12 are encouraged to use a face covering if able;
